Dear Parents and carers,

I hope that you are enjoying the Spring sunshine and that for our Muslim friends and colleagues that Ramadan is a time for peaceful reflection and spending time with the family. Unusually the feast of Eid-al Fitr will take place during the school holidays enabling the children to enjoy the feast without missing a day from school.

Term ends at the usual time on Thursday 28 March 2024 and the Summer Term begins on Monday 15 April 2024.

During the school holiday it is important that students in Years 11 and 13 spend the time preparing for the examinations that will start soon after the term begins.

We are inviting specific students to revision sessions in History, Geography, Computer Science, Art, Photography, Drama, Product Design and Turkish.

There will be two sessions, a morning session that will run from 9am - 11am and a second from 11:30 - 1:30. You will be contacted by your child's Progress Lead if your child is expected to attend.

Each session will involve intensive learning and revision which will require your child to be on time and fully equipped with writing equipment and a bottle of water.

If your child is staying for both sessions, they should bring a healthy snack and they will be given a break at 11:30.

Students are not required to wear school uniform, but they must bring their ID card and lanyard and they must wear sensible and appropriate clothing.


When term begins, we will be scheduling our Study Zone for Saturday revision, and also the Library will have extended opening hours for Year 11 and 13 students.

Please contact the Welfare Office should you have any questions.



IMPORTANT EXAMINATION INFORMATION

Dear Candidates/Parents

Year 11 GCSE + Year 10 Pre Public Exams

EXPECTATIONS FOR STUDENTS

- Make sure you check the seating plans posted in the playground in case there is a change of room for your exam (line up in the playground at least 15 minutes before the start time)
- Bring all the equipment you will need for the exam [black pens, pencils, ruler, calculator (where allowed), protractor, compasses]
- Full school uniform/smart business wear needs to be worn, with IDs placed on the exam desk
- Make sure you understand the rules
- Mobile phones/smart watches, or any other product with potential technological/web enabled sources of
 information must be switched off and put in bags. Any student found with such a device on them in an exam
 room will face disqualification from that exam
- Any pencil cases taken into the exam room must be see-through
- Only small water bottles will be allowed into the exam room and must have all labels removed

You must not take into the exam room:

- Notes
- a calculator case/instruction leaflet

Listen to the invigilators and follow their instructions during the exam.

A Level Turkish - Trip to Istanbul - 19-23 October 2023



Edmonton County School Turkish students and staff
embarked on our third trip to Istanbul on October 19, 2023.

We stayed in the old town in the centre of Istanbul which
was within walking distance to most of the places of interest,
although it is also convenient to get around the city by tram, metro, bus, or ferry.

However, we were lucky enough to have our own coach.

We went to the Blue Mosque, which is famous for the blue tiles that surround its interior walls. The mosque's design is

also beautiful. It was an excellent way for us to learn more about Islam and to gain a better understanding of the Muslim faith. We also went to Hagia Sophia, a building that was built in 537 and reminded us of the city's rich history. Over the years Hagia Sophia has been a church, mosque, and now it's a museum. The Grand Bazaar was one of our favourite places in Istanbul, not only for the variety of products on sale, but also the people watching which is second to none. We loved just manoeuvring through the crowded streets and bought presents for our loved ones.





We attended a Primary and Secondary school in Beyoglu, Istanbul. The school's Principal and teachers greeted us warmly. ECS students were permitted to observe the lessons of the children in Primary school.

Meanwhile, they conversed with them and learned about the Turkish educational system. The English story books collected from ECS students and teachers were also donated to the Libraries of this school. Later that day, we went to the High School. Our students were able to converse with their classmates and compare and contrast the Turkish and British education systems. Most importantly, they gained a thorough

understanding of the Turkish educational system, which was one of the A Level Turkish exam research topics. The Head and Deputy of the International Student's Department at Istanbul's Bahcesehir University welcomed us warmly. We went to a University education seminar that had been specially organised for us. After visiting the University's departments, we went on a campus tour. A wonderful surprise was our students receiving a gift!

Turkiye is located at the crossroads of Europe and Asia and has a diverse and multi-ethnic cuisine. Restaurants in Istanbul serve a wide range of cuisines, including kebabs, pide, various cheeses, breads, olives, eggplant dishes, and dried fruits. We also ate a fish sandwich cooked on a boat moored along the Bosphorus near Eminonu. The majority of Istanbul's major historical sites are on the European side of the city however, across the Bosphorus, in Asia, is the more

modern and progressive part of Istanbul. On this 90-minute fantastic boat tour, we were able to see several of Istanbul's most notable sights from the Bosphorus. Once we set sail, we saw palaces, castles, and notable landmarks along the European and Asian coasts. During the cruise, the boat passed by famous landmarks such as the Golden Horn, Dolmabahçe Palace, Bosphorus Bridge, Ortaköy Mosque, and Hagia Sophia.

The trip was very successful, thanks to the assistance provided by Mr Deniz during the trip and Mr Hosier for taking us to the airport.

Istanbul's beauty was something I'll never forget. In fact, this trip and these five days will stay with me for the rest of my life. I had a fantastic time there. Istanbul is a stunning city, and I consider myself fortunate to have witnessed it person. I am Turkish, but I had never been there before so thanks to Mr Deniz and Miss Osman for organising this trip. I am extremely grateful to Miss Osman especially for all of her efforts on this trip before, during, and after. We had a fantastic time that words cannot describe.

It was an honour to be a part of such a trip. I have absolutely no regrets.

We went to many different places, one of which was the famous Marmara Sea, where we could see the Bosphorus bridge that connected the two continents. We could also see other famous places such as the Topkapi Palace. We went there as well. I couldn't believe I was in TOPKAPI PALACE! It didn't feel real. We saw the swords used in battle, the throne, the clothes they wore, and so on. It was worthwhile to see everything.

The next day, we went to Dolmabahçe Palace, which was very impressive. I learned that this palace was the kingdom's second home after Topkap Palace. The architecture there was the first thing that drew my attention; it was stunning. It was great to see actual objects and furniture from the Ottoman Empire. Unfortunately, due to construction, we

couldn't see many rooms, but that didn't stop us from enjoying ourselves. The journey was not only enjoyable but also educational.

conquering Istanbul in 1453.
It was very educational to learn
about the history of the place we
were staying at the time.



We learned about Istanbul's history by visiting places like the Basilica Cistern, where the city's first drinking water source was discovered, and the Hagia Sofia mosque, both of which were fascinating. I discovered that the Hagia Sofia mosque was originally a church before being converted into a mosque. There were jiberal images but arabic writing. It was fascinating to see two religions coexisting in one place.

We went to so many places that it's difficult to list them all. The Egyptian and the Grand Bazaar was also a lovely place, but it was CROWDED!
