READY, SET, MOW!

Last summer the maintenance committee met with eight mowing companies for consideration of the upcoming 48-month mowing contract. All eight companies submitted bids with varying rates. The committee then narrowed their decision down to four companies.

Superior Landscape was ultimately awarded the contract for the next four years. Their knowledge of the subdivision and very competitive bid made them the obvious choice. Their contract includes individual lawns being mowed with 21" mowers and leaf removal.


Sections in the subdivision that include lawn care in their deed restrictions will continue to be serviced on their existing days. Crestwood and the optional areas are mowed 39 times a year and Bendwood and Tiffany are mowed 35 times a year. The service includes mow, blow, and edge only. Any additional maintenance or additional days of service must be provided through the resident.

Montclair Drainage Project – Phase II

The City of Sugar Land will soon begin the second phase of the Montclair Blvd. drainage project. Work is scheduled to begin in March and will include the upsizing of existing storm sewer pipes, outfall and inlets along with pavement replacement for not only Montclair, but also Wellington, Charleston and Country Club to the city limits of Stafford. Residents in the area will receive door hangers and notices from the city prior to beginning the work. This second phase will complete an estimated \$8.8 million improvement provided by the G.O. Bond approved by voters in 2019.



Annual Board of Director Election

Our Sugar Creek Homes Association consists of a nine-member board of residents who are elected by all homeowners in the subdivision. This board is responsible for overseeing the activities of the Association.

The deadline to file as a candidate for the Board of Directors election is February 16, 2024 at 5 pm. This year three positions are open: Pct. I, Pct. II and an At-Large position. Precinct candidates must live in the precinct for which they run. However, all residents are eligible to hold the At-Large position. Each household in the subdivision is entitled to vote for all three positions.

Stafford Starts Recycling

Stafford has renewed their waste contract with GFL Environmental. Under the new contract, GFL will begin collecting recycling items. According to a representative from Stafford, the timeline for receiving your bin (with literature) will be between January 15th – January 26th. The scheduled recycling day for Stafford residents in Sugar Creek will be Fridays with February 2nd being the first day of collection.

2024 Assessments are Due

Just a reminder that the 2024 assessments are due. All payments made after January 31st will incur a late fee. The association relies on your annual assessments for several reasons, including employing off-duty police officers to patrol the subdivision, maintaining and improving common areas of Sugar Creek, and overseeing the pool and park. We thank you for your continued support in helping us preserve Sugar Creek!







Happy New Year Sugar Creek! I hope 2024 has brought you good health and happiness! Our Garden Club will have its annual Valentine Friendship Luncheon at Sugar Creek Country Club on Saturday, February 10, at 10:30 a.m. Please join us in celebrating with good friends, and raising money through our silent auction. Contact Trisha Muska at 832.752.6738 for reservations. The cost is \$35. Did you know that over 10 million roses are purchased for Valentine's Day? It is by far the most common flower given on that day. The most popular rose color is red, which means love. The light pink symbolizes admiration; while the dark pink means appreciation. Yellow signifies friendship; while purple represents passion.

And while roses are the most popular, let me offer another idea: consider an Anthurium house plant. It will last long after cut roses have died. It has shiny heart shaped "blooms" in bright red, which are actually leaves. It will produce "blooms" all year round, and is easy to grow in a light-filled spot.

Mid-February is the time to prune your crepe myrtles, fruit/nut trees, and shrub roses. It's also time to plant late-blooming bulbs like gladiolus and cannas; and pinch back pansies and cyclamen. To lawns, apply pre-emergent herbicides to block spring weeds and "early green up" fertilizer (15-5-10) to brighten your yard.



Stafford Alarm Permit

The City of Stafford requires an annual alarm permit for residents that operate an alarm in the city. Alarm permit fee is \$30 annually and expires December 31st of each year. If the police respond to an alarm and you do not have a valid permit, you can be issued a citation. Residents can download the form from the city's website. For further information, call The City of Stafford at 281.403.595.

Sugar Land does not require an alarm permit. It is important to have a current Alarm Monitoring Agreement on file with the Association. If you have not updated your agreement in a few years, the form is located on our website.
